As a department, we firmly believe that reading helps students build vocabulary, grammatical awareness, and writing skills. Most importantly, we believe that reading is fun. As such, we have designed a new and exciting summer reading program to encourage students to read!

This summer, all incoming students must read at least five books (personal copy or from the library) and complete a book report for each book read. We have enclosed a copy of the book report form they will need to complete. These five book reports will be graded and included in the student's first term grade for English.

These books must be in English, primarily written text (no graphic novels), contain multiple chapters, and be at least 100 pages in length. These five books must be read during the summer and not a report on a book read during the school year. Books may be fiction or nonfiction, but they should challenge the student either in content or vocabulary.
